What you'll do

As a School-Based Therapist, you will provide therapeutic and case management services to youth clients and families experiencing violence, trauma, and mental health concerns. You will report to the Deputy Director of Programs and Clinical Supervision and work collaboratively with all staff members and volunteers to further PAVE's mission. Key responsibilities are as follows:

- Build and maintain an individual caseload of 12-15 clients per week
- Conduct individual, group, and family therapeutic interventions in partner schools
- Provide case management, crisis interventions, and referral support services
- Collaborate with multiple adults within the school community and the family of clients ensuring client needs are met
- Track and document services data on a monthly basis
- Attend and actively participate in weekly individual clinical supervision and monthly group supervision meetings

What makes you a great candidate for this role

- Master's degree and at least one year of experience in counseling, social work, psychology, or other related field
- Comprehensive knowledge of intervention strategies related to youth survivors of violence, marginalized communities and the systems that impact their lives
- Strong communication, listening, and healthy relationship skills
- Strong and effective strategies and tools for managing secondary trauma and self-care

- Self-motivation and initiative skills
- Ability to work independently while excelling within a team environment
- Ability to speak conversational Spanish, preferred

Physical demands and work environment

- Office and classroom settings
- Lifting and carrying no more than 20 pounds at a time
- Walking, standing and moving for long periods of time

What you will receive

The base salary for this 10.5-month position is \$49,910. Flexible schedule and generous benefits including a 32-hour work week, tenure bonuses, 100% employee health insurance, 100% employee dental insurance, 401K with employer match up to 2%, paid holidays (including 2 floating holidays and the week off after Christmas), personal time off, and sabbatical leave.
